Arnold Zable is an acclaimed writer, educator, and one of Australia's most loved story-tellers. His award-winning books include the memoirs *Jewels and Ashes* and *The Fig Tree*, and the bestselling novels *Café Scheherazade*, *Scraps of Heaven* and *Sea of Many Returns*.

His most recent book, *Violin Lessons*, is a collection of stories, which takes the reader on an intimate journey into the lives of people he has met on travels over the last forty years. He is the author of numerous stories, essays and features, and several works for theatre.

Zable has conducted numerous writing workshops throughout Australia and overseas, and lectured extensively on creative writing and the art of story. He is a human rights advocate, the president of International PEN, Melbourne and has a doctorate in creative arts, Melbourne University, where he is currently a Vice Chancellor's fellow.

Stories drawn from life, tales of journeys and family history, can be written in many ways, ranging from memoir to autobiography, from short story to novel, from personal journal to biography or tales simply written just for family.
